<b>(*)</b>	Use clay or play dough to make letters to spell your words.
<b>(*)</b>	Smooth out shave cream, sand, or flour and spell your words.
(F)	Rainbow spelling: Write each word in every color of the rainbow.
<b>(</b>	Put your words in alphabetical order.
<b>(</b>	Make a list of words that rhyme with your spelling words.
<b>(</b>	Dribble a ball or jump rope while spelling your words.
<b>(</b>	Write each spelling word five times each.
<b>(*)</b>	Tape record yourself spelling your words.
<b>(*)</b>	Write your words on someone's back with your finger.
<b>(*)</b>	Write your words in the air with your finger.
<b>(*)</b>	Write your words on a chalkboard or with sidewalk chalk
<b>(*)</b>	Make a crossword puzzle or word search puzzle with your words.
<b>(*)</b>	Cut out letters from magazines or newspapers to spell your words.
<b>(*)</b>	Use magnet letters to spell your words.
<b>(*)</b>	Use pipe cleaners to make the letters to spell your words.
<b>(*)</b>	Use a typewriter or computer to type your spelling words.
<b>(*)</b>	Use alphabet cereal/pasta to spell each spelling word.
<b>(*)</b>	Write a story. Try to use all of this week's spelling words.
<b>(</b>	Use pieces of yarn to form the letters in your spelling words.
